What are Shared Branch Services?

As a credit union member, you enjoy unique benefits like Shared Branch Services — a feature created around the idea of cooperation among credit unions to offer more convenience to members. Shared Branch Services or “shared branching” allows Hawaii Federal Credit Union members to perform a number of transactions at other credit union branches that participate in the partnership. You now have access to a national network of credit unions where you can perform many of the same banking activities that you enjoy at your credit union — without the hassle of surcharges.

With 68 Shared Branch Service locations in Hawaii and thousands more on the mainland, it’s convenient to do your banking both on island and on the go. It’s just another way Hawaii FCU puts members first and strives for stress-free money management.

How Shared Branching Works

In order to perform a Shared Branch transaction, simply visit a partner credit union and make sure you bring the following items with you:

- Credit Union Name
- Account Number
- Valid Picture ID (driver’s license, state ID, military ID, passport, alien ID card)

Transaction Guidelines for Shared Branching

Before you head to a shared branch to take care of your banking needs, there are a few guidelines you should keep in mind:

Shared Branch Services are limited to the following transactions:

- Cash Withdrawals (limited to the lesser of the member’s available balance or the outlet’s available cash, at least \$500)
- Deposits (coin deposits subject to the customary policies and fees of the outlet)
- Check Withdrawals (limited to funds available)
- Traveler’s Checks (no fees for single signature checks; dual signature checks are subject to credit union service fee)
- Money Orders
- Loan Payments

Immediate credit* will be given for the following types of deposits:

- Cash Deposits
- Government Checks (federal, state & local)
- US Postal Money Orders
- Payroll Checks
- Official Checks from Other Depository Institutions (cashier’s checks or teller checks from host credit union)
- Traveler’s Checks

* Restrictions may apply

The following transactions are not allowed:

- Loan Advances (personal lines of credit and home equity lines of credit)
- Visa Credit Card Payments
- Telephone Transfers
- Specially titled or restricted owner accounts
